Sturton & District Shed Club Code of Conduct

The following Code of Conduct will be strictly enforced for every member of Sturton & District Shed Club (The Shed) at all times

- 1. No form of abuse, violence, anti-social behaviour or infringements of the rights of others will be tolerated
- 2. Alcohol and drugs are prohibited in the shed and anyone entering the shed showing signs of being under the influence of such substances shall be asked to leave immediately
- 3. Shedders shall respect the confidentiality of individuals whether present or not. They will also refrain from mentioning any information that may cause embarrassment to any member.
- 4. Shedders must accept that 'The Shed' exists for everyone regardless of gender, religious beliefs, political views, nationality, disability, age or race.
- 5. Shedders will treat each other with fairness and consideration, showing regard for people's feelings and respect for their contribution.
- 6. Sheds work best when shedders work as a team. Everyone should therefore take responsibility for helping and supporting each other.
- 7. Every shedder has a responsibility for Health & Safety and ensuring safe working practices are adhered to at all times by everyone. Each shedder should consider themselves a safety officer and try and stop bad practice happening, regardless of any other individual appointed to that role.
- 8. Shedders must be flexible in their use of shed equipment, allowing others space and time for their projects. If differences occur in which the individuals cannot find an amicable solution then the problem should be referred to the shed management committee for an arbitrated settlement.
- 9. No shedder or committee member shall use the shed or its equipment for personal gain.
- 10. All financial rewards derived from the activities of the shed shall be for the benefit of 'The Shed' as a whole

Any person breaking this Code of Conduct will be given a warning about their behaviour or may be asked to leave 'The Shed' and only be allowed to return after consideration by the committee. If a member is permanently barred a refund of the balance of their membership fee will be repaid.
